### Year 6 SATs

As you know, Year 6 will sit their SAT examinations in May. Attendance to school EVERY day is crucial! As is the completion of any homework set.

The test details are as follows:

Date	Test
Monday 12 May 2025	English grammar, punctuation and spelling papers 1 and 2
Tuesday 13 May 2025	English reading
Wednesday 14 May 2025	Maths papers 1 and 2
Thursday 15 May 2025	Maths paper 3

#### What you need to know about KS2 SATs

#### Maths SATs - KS2:

- The Key Stage 2 maths tests will check your skills on arithmetic and reasoning.
- The arithmetic test will check your skills on things like adding and subtracting, using fractions, decimals, and percentages.





















• The reasoning test is all about getting you to show how well you understand things like like algebra, volumes and simplifying fractions.

#### **English SATs - KS2:**

- The Key Stage 2 SATs papers for English will test you on grammar, punctuation and spelling as well as reading.
- The grammar, punctuation and spelling paper will test you on everything from spelling, to pronouns, to conjunctions.
- The reading paper will give you some short stories and non-fiction texts, which you'll be asked some questions about.

#### **Free School Meals**

Help Us Access Additional Funding for Your Child's Education!

We want to ensure that all our pupils receive the best possible support in school. Did you know that your child may be eligible for additional funding through the Pupil Premium? This funding is provided to schools by the government to help support eligible children and improve their educational experiences.

Your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-Based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guaranteed Element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income below £16,190)
- Universal Credit with a household income below £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you receive)

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and already receives free school meals as part of the government's Universal Infant Free School Meals scheme, applying for Pupil Premium means the school receives extra funding to provide further support for your child.

Applying is quick and easy, and it can make a real difference to the resources, support, and opportunities we can provide for all our pupils. - Your child will have a reading book they must read it every day.
- They also have a reading record this must be signed by a parent/carer every day.
- Both the reading book and the reading record must be brought into school EVERY day.
- Your child will also have a library book that they can read for pleasure.
- In total, your child should be reading for at least 20 minutes each day!
